Through a few years' study, students acquire knowledge and experience here. Many people say that university time is among the best days in their life, but that doesn't mean it is without problems, some of which are listed below:

- Anxiety
- Time management
- Money problems
- The need to show oneself

Starting one's university life can be a difficult experience. While most students will agree that they once felt a bit puzzled for a few weeks, the following tips can give some useful **references**:

#### Managing Anxiety

Much anxiety is based on false opinions about personal ability, study requirements or the experience of failures. You can manage such anxiety /æŋg'zaīətī/ n. 焦虑; 担心

- Focus on what you can do and what you will do next.
- Put some time aside to think clearly what is really required.
- Break some whole tasks down into smaller pieces.
- Seek opportunities to study with others.
- Celebrate small successes along the way.

#### Managing Time

Managing your time is important to your college life. The most important part of successful study is good time management. You feel calmer and more in self-control if your time is planned well, and more confident about meeting your **deadlines**. If you're still having trouble, here are some tips:

There is no ideal length for study time. Much depends on the subject, how smart you are and sometimes simply how fast a reader you are. Maybe it's useful to think about when you can study most efficiently in a day — morning, afternoon or evening. You should make sure that you do the **routine** things in suitable periods of the day so that you can use your best time for doing more important work.

#### Using Money

Entering college means you are becoming an adult but still getting financial help from your parents. It's very **crucial** to arrange your limited money with reasonable rules given below:

• Write it down — Keep account of every penny.

• Spread your money — If you take out a loan, spread it across a period of time rather than spending it all at once.

• Be **sensible** — Think about your needs for not only today but also tomorrow.

• **Maximize** your income — Firstly, cut your spending on dear items or non-essentials. Secondly, see if you can save on your essential supplies. Thirdly, try to get a part-time or holiday job.
