Taxi services have made travel much more convenient. In case of being unfamiliar with an area you can choose to take a taxi to your destination. Taxi services make us not dependent on a car that may break down or a friend who forgets to show up. Taxi services offer independence that is greatly needed in the hectic modern world.

The idea behind taxi services dates all the way back to the seventeenth century. Drivers of horse-drawn carriages would negotiate a fee with a customer who needed to travel to a desired location. The invention of automobiles created a boom in the taxi services industry. Modernizations such as the computer systems installed in taxi cabs in the 1980s made taxi travel even more affordable and convenient.

The types of taxi services available are often dependent on geography — different areas offer different types of services. Big cities like New York or Los Angeles have a much greater demand for taxi services due to traffic congestion and a lack of available parking space. Areas that are in the vicinity of an airport or a train station will also have a high demand for taxi services. Prices will be higher in rural areas where taxi travel is less common.



If time is of the essence, many taxi services will pick you up at your location if you call their business phone number and make arrangements. These taxi services are often more expensive, but can guarantee that you will make your appointment in time.

But sometimes your ride will cost you about the same as a train trip if you don't get discounts. Luckily, there are plenty of them. You will get a 10% discount if you buy round-trip tickets. Greyhound sometimes has a companion fare discount, where two people can ride for the cost of one ticket. They have a seven-day advance-purchase fare called the "Greyhound Friendly Fare". Greyhound also offers a military discount, a children's discount, a senior discount and a Student Advantage (学生优惠) discount.



Foreign travelers traveling to Canada or Mexico must have the proper travel documents. U.S., Canadian and Mexican citizens should have a birth certificate, passport or naturalization paper. If you are not a citizen of the U.S., Canada or Mexico, a passport is required. In certain cases a visa may be required as well. These documents will be necessary and may be checked at boarding, before boarding to Canada or Mexico, or on the trip to these countries.
